## Parking program pressures

#### **Decreased revenue**

Infrequent rate increases; only 6.4% increase since 2010

#### **Increased costs**

- City of Seattle parking taxes (~\$2M a year, near double since 2015)
- Impact of CPI increases (up 18% since 2010)
- Investment in modernization and IT (self-serve machines, pay by phone, etc.)
- Deferred maintenance costs for aging lots and garages
- ADA compliance and remediation

## Impact of Campus Master Plan over next 10 years

- The UW has agreed to achieve the following by 2028:
  - 12% drive alone rate (currently at 19%)
  - 9,000 parking spaces cap (currently 12,200 spaces)
- Sharp reduction in trips/spaces will reduce parking revenue

## U District parking rate analysis

- Analysis compared UW parking rates to other parking options near campus
  - With 12,200 parking spaces, UW is by far biggest provider of parking in area
  - Nearby private lots are competitive on price when it comes to daily rates, but more expensive when it comes to monthly rates
  - Street parking in the same area is paid and time restricted
    - \$2.50/hr for 2 hours max (U District core)
    - \$1/hr for 4 hours max (U District edge)

UW rate	\$15.00	\$150.00
Average non-UW	\$13.89	\$175.63
Lowest non-UW	\$10.00	\$145.00
Highest non-UW	\$24.00	\$250.00



# Possible options for parking rates

Product	Current	8% increase	15% increase	
Single occupancy vehicle	\$150/month	\$162/month	\$173/month	
Visitor	\$15/day	\$16/day	\$17/day	
Pay-per-use parking (PPUP)	\$7.50/day	\$8.10/day	\$8.65/day	



## **U-PASS** for faculty & professional staff

#### **Current state**

- User fees only cover 59% of program costs
- One rate increase since 2010 (14% in 2015)
- 98% of revenue goes directly to pay transit fares
- Transit ridership continues to increase

## **Future state: Higher costs expected**

- Higher usage coming with Link light rail expansion:
  - **2021**: U District/Roosevelt/Northgate
  - **2023**: Eastside
  - **2024**: Lynnwood, Shoreline
- Anticipated transit fare increases

**Important note**: Any increase in user fees would go to support the program for faculty and professional staff ONLY. It would not go to support the U-PASS program for either classified staff or students.



# Possible options for U-PASS rates for faculty & professional staff

User fees	Current	8% increase	15% increase	
Annual pass	\$600	\$648	\$684	
Quarterly costs	\$150	\$162	\$171

## Future discussion topic: Gratis U-PASS

#### **Current state**

- SOV, motorcycle & carpool permit holders receive a gratis U-PASS
- Vanpool drivers and bookkeepers receive a gratis U-PASS
- Median usage is 6 trips a year; 35% of participants never use it at all

## **Next steps**

April 10: Special UTC meeting to review rate proposal

Mid-April: Outreach to key stakeholders

April 22: UTC meeting

May 9: Board of Regents vote on rate proposal

July 1: New rates (if approved) take effect

Note: Annual Renewal starts April 15. Faculty and staff will be notified that rate increases are being considered and that they will have a chance to cancel after renewing before any new rates take effect.

## Citation rate increases proposed

### > Revise fine schedule to match City of Seattle

- Reduce incentive for illegal parkers to opt for UW vs city streets
- Protect parking spaces for permit holders and maintain ADA compliance
